Team The gallery will vacate 47 Wooster Street at the end of this month for the usual reason — an exorbitant rent increase. However, <u>Cory Arcangel</u> has a project up in the Wooster Street space — an audio work that recreates and revises RUN-D.M.C.'s "Sucker MCs," using the Oberheim DMX drum machine. Team will continue to mount shows at its <u>83 Grand Street</u> address, where Ross Knight's new sculptures, through Sunday, combine mundane industrial materials to create objects that look like uncanny fetishes.
